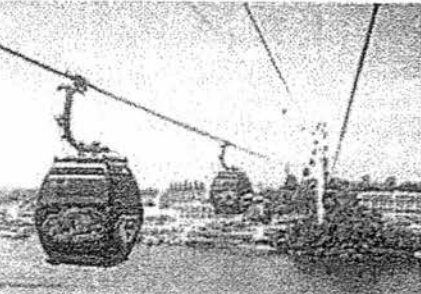

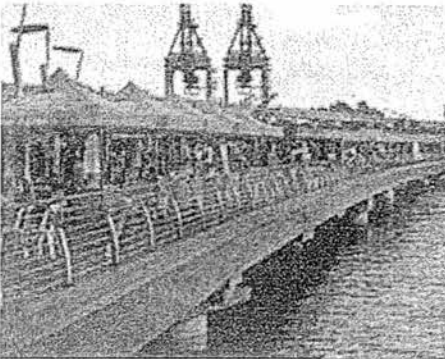

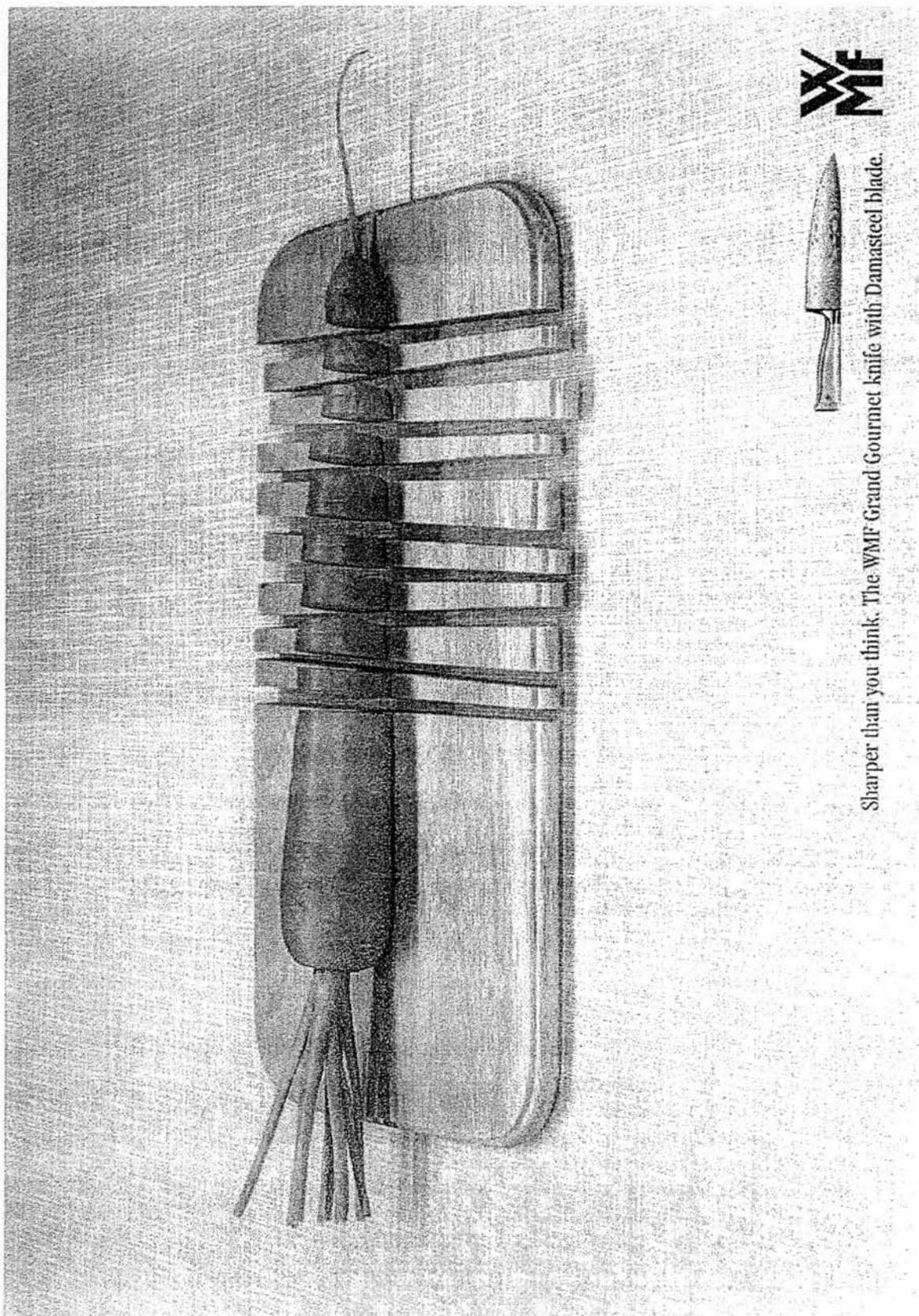

- 2 I run and the adrenalin hits me. Sweat trickles down my face. I know I should turn back but this is my guilty secret. I sprint directionless through damp meadows, grass up to my waist as no human has set foot here in decades. If anyone knew, I'd be arrested. 5
- 3 I race home, exhilarated. No one has seen me as no one ever leaves his computerised home anymore. Everyone is overweight and terrified of stepping outside the world of the Internet. The government uses weight to control society, like puppeteers pulling the strings of their obese, obedient dolls. Everyone except me. No one has ever seen me sprinting through the fields because no one ever looks past their screens, but tonight I feel like someone is watching me... 10
- 4 Jonathan sat in the middle of his lifeless bedroom with his laptop on his knees. His face was pale and dark circles sat beneath his eyes. Once again, he was up late, hacking into the government's satellite. A triumphant smile stretched across his face. 15
- 5 He scrolled over England and zoomed in on his local area, feeling like he had a VIP pass into everyone's lives. Their soulless faces locked onto computer screens made him feel miserable. Jonathan needed some excitement. He decided to shift to the countryside, remembering with trepidation the frightening stories he'd read online about this mysterious place. 20
- 6 His speakers began to play a relaxing sound: the wind in the trees. He was drifting off to sleep when he saw movement and jolted. A figure, moving swiftly. Tall and thin like a character from one of those vintage Nintendo games. A ghost? No, a living, breathing, running girl! 25
- 7 Jonathan watched, fascinated. He began to want this strange world of freedom and movement. He felt his heart thud against his chest. He felt the muscles in his legs ache. He knew he should report her but he'd be arrested for hacking into their satellite. His mind repeated the words he sees every morning when he logs-on to school:
- 8 'The Government looks after you. Trust the Government.' 30
- 9 His conscience fought with his instincts. He'd trusted the government but now they seemed to have become evil. The report button was just a couple of centimetres from his little finger. If he pressed it, her freedom would disappear along with his laptop...
- 10 When I arrive home from my run, I'm exhausted. I flop onto my bed and breathe sighs of relief, just like I always do when I make it back home and know I've not been spotted. 35
- 11 I log-on to my laptop to find one new e-mail. It reads:
- 12 You need new trainers.

The article below is about smart phones and digital addiction in Singapore. Read it carefully and answer Questions 20-27 in the Question Paper.

- 1 "Let's talk about the people of Singapore and about smartphones. There is not much difference. In Singapore, I have seen the future and I shuddered. I've seen people scroll pages of the smartphone for endless minutes, without doing anything, or without launching any applications. I have seen the future and I know now that life is better in the past." That was what Italian Giorgio Fochesato felt when he visited Singapore. 5
- 2 Walk along the streets of Singapore or take the public transport and you will easily notice what Giorgio was talking about. Just take a ride on the public Mass Rapid Transport System (MRT) and you will understand how smartphones have ruined people. People walk down the street holding a tablet with two hands, without much awareness of where they are going; what is most important to them is not to miss the latest episode of Korean drama on their devices. It does not matter if they walk into someone else. The important thing is to never remove their gaze from their rectangular friends. 10
- 3 Smartphone addiction is a real thing and it is slowly becoming serious. According to a recent report, psychiatrists in Singapore are pushing for medical authorities to formally recognise addiction to the Internet and digital devices as a disorder, joining other countries around the world in addressing this growing problem. 15
- 4 According to the same report, Tan Hwee Sim, a consultant psychiatrist at The Resilienz Mind clinic in Singapore, noted that the symptoms exhibited by her young adult patients have changed over the years. "Internet addiction as a disorder is not even listed in our latest psychiatric manual. It's only listed in the appendix as a disorder that requires further study," she said. 20
- 5 Another consultant at the anesthesiology department of Singapore General Hospital, Tan Kian Hian told the Straits Times that, in terms of physical symptoms, more people are reporting "text neck" or "iNeck" pain. 25
- 6 "It is a commonly observed phenomenon that many people have their heads lowered and are now using their mobile devices constantly on the go, while queuing or even crossing the roads," Tan added.
- 7 Signs of addiction? Trisha Lin, an assistant professor in communications at the Nanyang Technological University, defined digital addiction by a number of symptoms; the inability to control craving, anxiety when separated from a smartphone, loss in productivity in studies or at work, the need to constantly check one's phone. 30
- 8 So what can be done to overcome this addiction? If you or any of your friends do exhibit these symptoms, do seek professional help. In Singapore, there are two counselling centres – the National Addictions Management Services and Touch Community Services – with programmes for digital addiction. Unplug from virtual reality and return to physical reality. 35

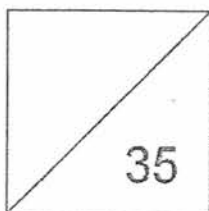
