$$x = \frac{-b \pm \sqrt{b^2 - 4ac}}{2a}$$

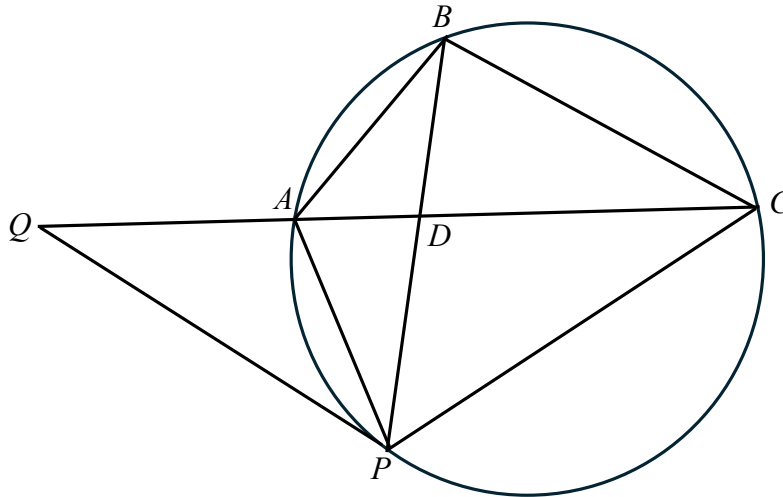

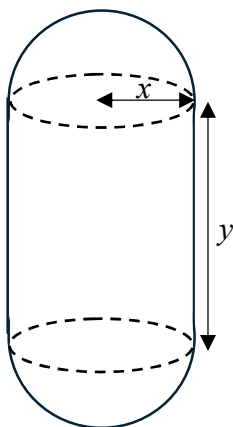

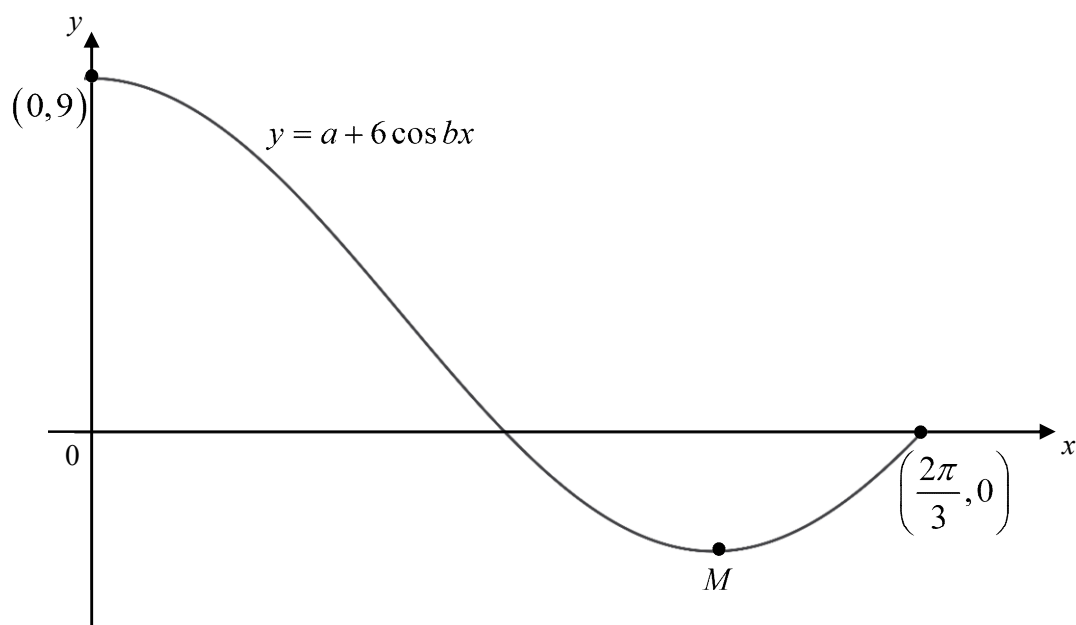
The diagram shows a solid object made from joining two hemispheres of radius x cm to a cylinder of height y cm. The volume of the object is 750 cm^3 .

Find the value of a and of b .

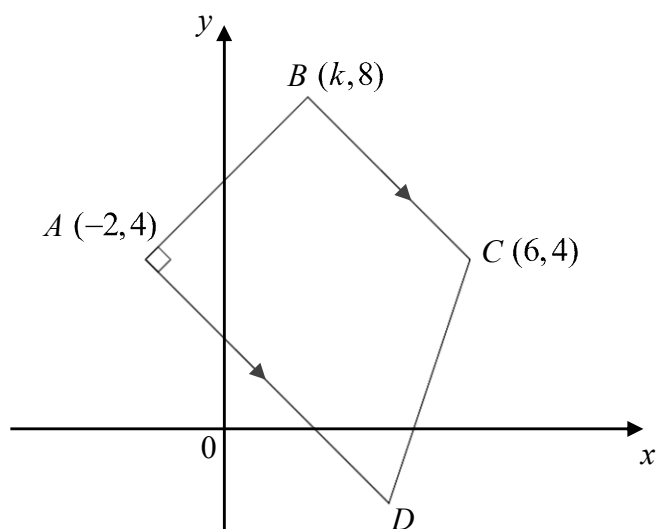

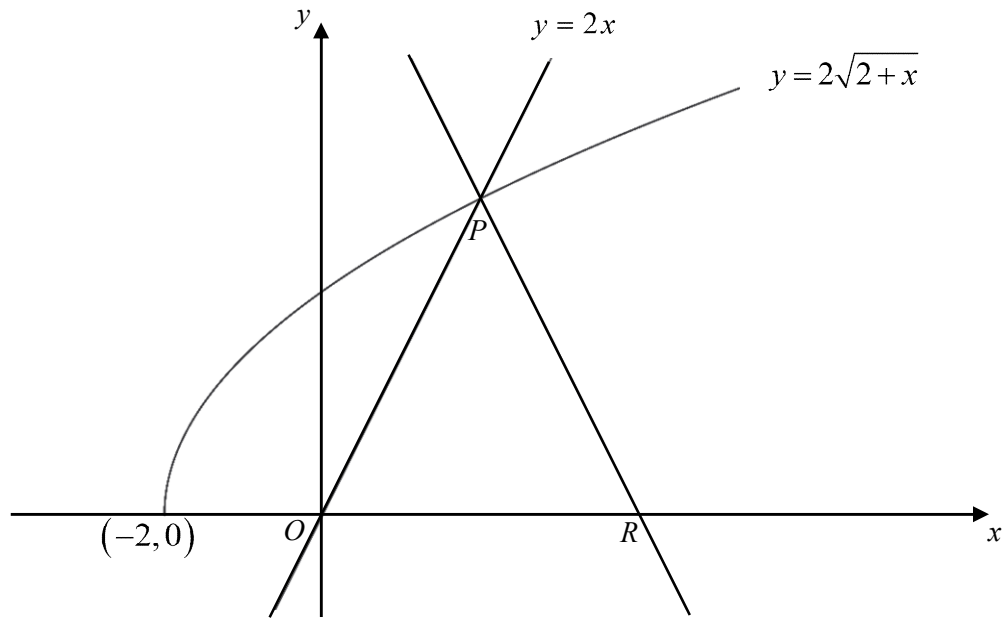

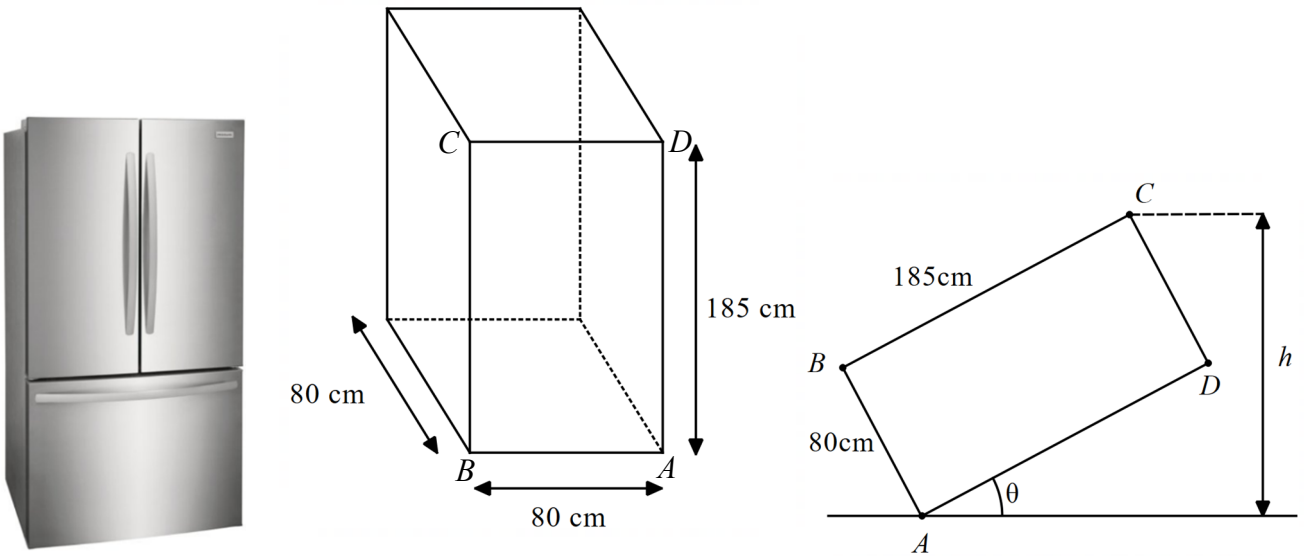

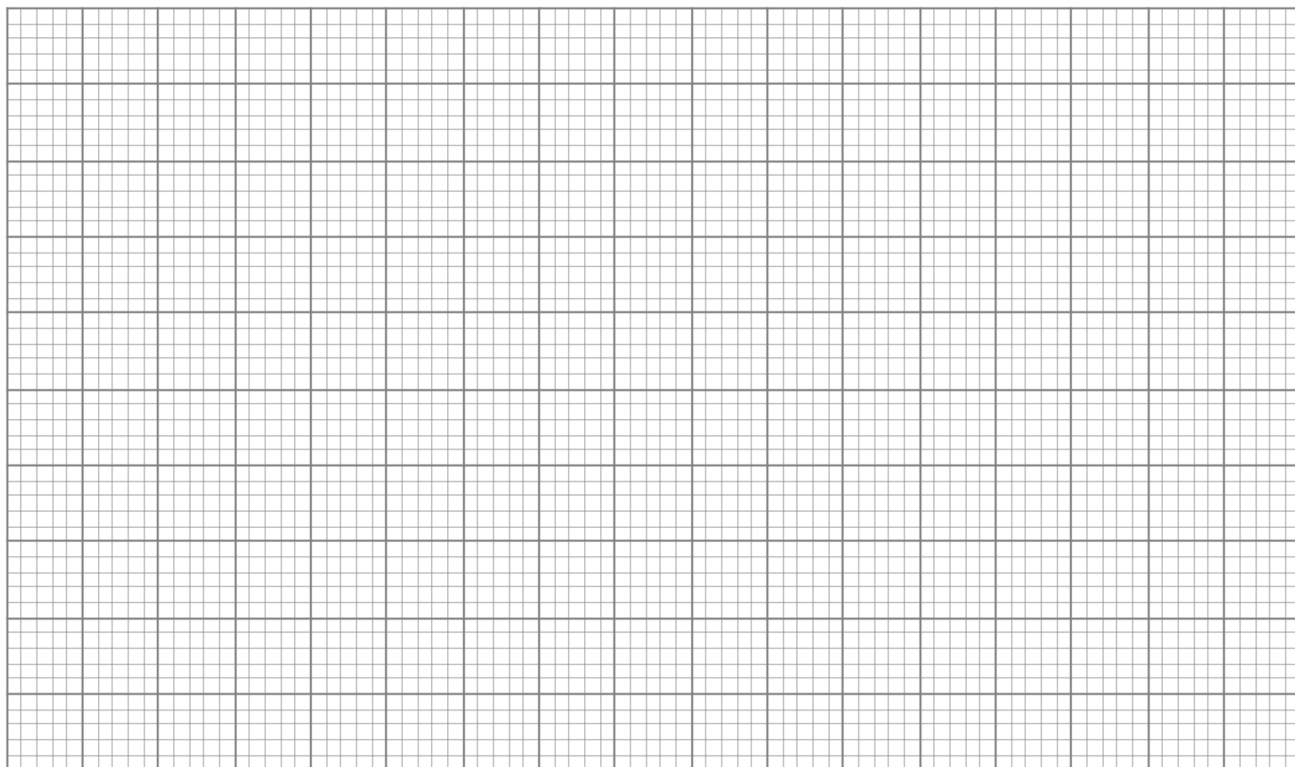

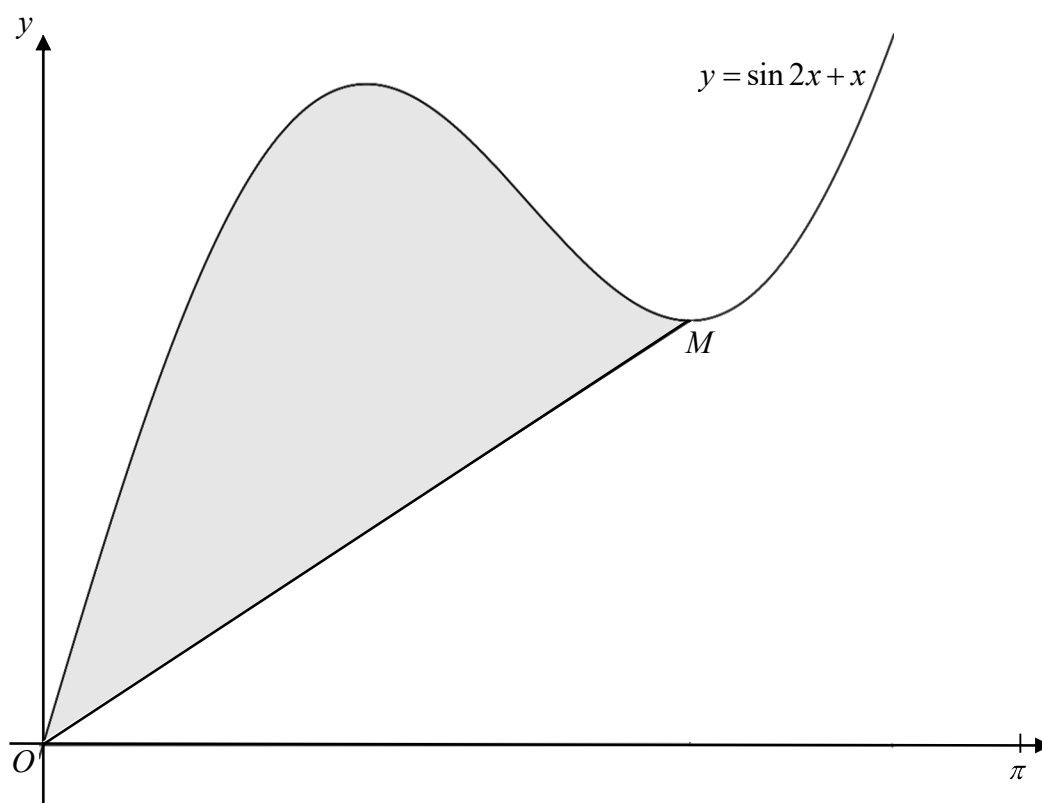
